be respectful, resilient, and resourceful

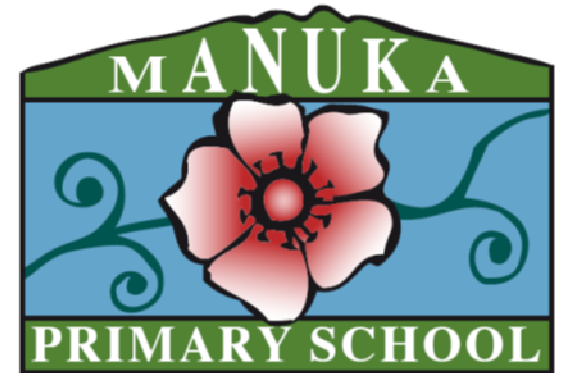
have the literacy and numeracy skills necessary for effective functioning in all aspects of life
